




Supply and Demand	It has been reported that the Super Basmati paddy market in Sindh is exhibiting a declining trend, with prices experiencing a significant reduction from PKR 5,600 – 5,800 to PKR 4,600–4,700 , reflecting an approximate decline of 17-18% . This adjustment positions Pakistan's Super Basmati export prices at around \$970–\$975 per metric ton, compared to India's Pusa Basmati priced at \$750–\$850 per metric ton. Despite this price correction, Pakistan's rates remain uncompetitive in attracting European Union buyers, who continue to show reluctance toward procuring Pakistani Basmati rice.

In contrast, domestic raw rice prices have remained stable, holding steady at \$23.5 since mid-December. The market reflects contrasting trends, with paddy prices softening while domestic rice prices remain consistent. Additionally, good stocks of rice are available for export, ensuring a reliable supply for international buyers.








Supply and Demand	Good stocks of long-grain non-Basmati varieties, specifically IRRI-6, are reported to be available and are anticipated to see increased trade activity in the coming weeks or months. This follows Bangladesh's issuance of a tender to procure 50,000 tons of IRRI-6 rice from Pakistan. Although the Paddy shows a downward trend in prices and domestic raw rice prices were stable showing minor fluctuations.

PAKISTAN NEWS HIGHLIGHTS:

- Parliamentary Secretary Zulfiqar Ali Bhatti informed the National Assembly about government efforts to promote rice exports and address exporters' concerns. He highlighted Pakistan's 11% share in the global rice trade and competition from India, Vietnam, and Thailand. Acknowledging past issues with substandard shipments to Europe, he emphasized measures to improve quality standards and address grievances. Action has been taken against 17 officials, and the matter has been referred to the standing committee for further review. Read More (17th Jan).
- The Pakistan National Shipping Corporation (PNSC) and the Rice Exporters Association of Pakistan (REAP) have agreed to collaborate to boost rice exports and reduce foreign shipping costs. During a meeting in Karachi, REAP proposed forming a joint committee to utilize PNSC services and cut the \$300 million spent annually on foreign shipping. PNSC assured full support, highlighting mutual benefits, while REAP cited successful bulk shipments to Bangladesh and optimism about future collaboration. Read More (16th Jan).
- The Trading Corporation of Pakistan (TCP) and the Directorate General of Food, Bangladesh, signed an MoU to facilitate rice exports from Pakistan. The agreement, signed by TCP Chairman Syed Rafeo Bashir Shah and Director General Md. Abdul Khaleque, was hailed as a step toward strengthening bilateral trade ties. Pakistan's High Commissioner also presented a goodwill gift of rice to Bangladesh's Adviser for Food on behalf of Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif. Read More (15th Jan).
- Economic collaboration between Azerbaijan and Pakistan is expanding with initiatives like establishing an Azerbaijan Trade Centre and the Pakistan-Azerbaijan Chamber of Commerce. Azerbaijan Ambassador Khazar Farhadov emphasized the duty-free access granted to Pakistani rice until 2027 and invited Pakistani investors to explore opportunities in infrastructure and energy sectors. Bilateral trade has significantly grown, and Azerbaijan's strategic position as a transport corridor enhances regional trade connections. Read More (14th Jan).

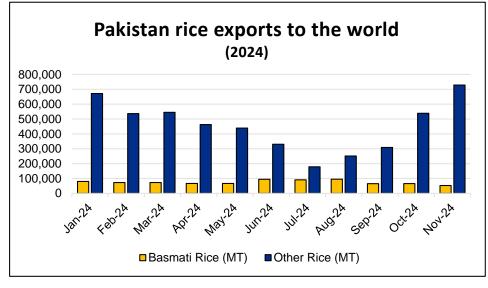





The Pakistani rice market has seen a notable decline in prices for Super Basmati rice, including conventional, SRP, and organic grades, with reductions ranging from \$25 to \$30. However, prices for 1121 varieties have remained stable. Non-Basmati rice varieties have experienced minimal fluctuations, with changes within a \$5 to \$10 range. Overall, the market remains subdued, with significant price drops primarily observed in the Super Basmati category.









As of January 19, 2025, It has been reported the rice prices have seen notable adjustments across various types. In the white rice category, India experienced a further drop, while Thailand and Vietnam saw sharper declines. Prices in Pakistan and the US remained stable. For parboiled rice, India recorded a decrease, with Pakistan and Thailand showing no changes, while the US reported an increase. In the fragrant rice segment, Thailand's Hom Mali rice prices rose, whereas Vietnam's Jasmine rice prices dropped significantly. Overall, the market continues to exhibit a bearish trend, driven heightened competition impacting prices across regions.

BANGLADESH'S RICE TRADE UPDATES:

Recent Initiatives and Procurement Efforts for Rice in Bangladesh and International Trade Relations.

- □ **50,000 Tonnes from Pakistan:** The government has approved the purchase of 50,000 tonnes of white rice from Pakistan under a government-to-government deal at \$499 per tonne.
- Relaxation of Procurement Rules: A relaxed provision of the Public Procurement Rules 2008 allows the food ministry to procure 3 lakh tonnes of rice through international tenders within 15 days, instead of the standard 42 days.
- □ **Total Rice Procurement:** The Directorate General of Food aims to procure 6 lakh tonnes of rice through international tenders, with 3 lakh tonnes already tendered.
- ☐ Additional Purchases: Discussions are ongoing with India and Vietnam to procure 1 lakh tonnes of rice from each country.
- □ **Recent Imports:** The food ministry expects to receive 1 lakh tonnes of rice this month from Myanmar, Bangladesh's southeastern neighbours.
- □ Stock and Pricing: The public stock of food grains was 12.25 lakh tonnes as of January 12, including 8.2 lakh tonnes of rice, reflecting a 25% decline year-on-year in stock levels.







GLOBAL NEWS HIGHLIGHTS OF THIS WEEK:



The Bangladeshi government is set to import seven lakh tonnes of rice to address food grain shortages and high rice prices exacerbated by inflation and rice shortages caused by floods. Efforts include importing from Myanmar, Pakistan, and Vietnam through government-to-government arrangements. The move aims to stabilize rice prices and ensure adequate food security. Vietnam faces challenges in maintaining its rice export growth due to increased global competition, especially as India resumes its rice exports. Despite a record high in 2024, with a surge in export prices, the market remains uncertain with reduced demand from traditional importers like the Philippines and a shift towards high-quality fragrant rice production. India's rice exports saw a significant rise of 64.03% in December 2024, reaching \$1.43 billion, up from \$0.87 billion in December 2023. This growth highlights India's strong presence in the global agricultural market, driven by increased global demand and competitive pricing. READ MORE (16-Jan)



The Department of Agriculture (DA) is reducing the price of 25% broken rice sold at Kadiwa stores from P40 to P38 per kilo under the "Rice-for-All" initiative. This initiative aims to provide affordable rice options, including a maximum suggested retail price (MSRP) of P58 for imported 5% broken rice, with plans to expand the program nationwide. <u>READ MORE</u> (16-Jan)



Nigeria has received a 32-ton shipment of rice from Thailand, marking the first such import in a decade, amidst a worsening food crisis. This shipment follows Nigeria's decision to implement a tariff moratorium on key food crops. Despite duty-free imports, purchases remain cautious due to concerns about impacts on local producers.
