# PAKISTAN NEWS HIGHLIGHTS:

- With the **U.S. imposing a 26% import tariff on Indian basmati rice**, **Pakistani exporters** are poised to benefit. The tariff could push American buyers to shift their sourcing towards Pakistan, given its competitive pricing due to the weaker Pakistani rupee (**PKR 280/USD vs. INR 85.5/USD**). Additionally, **Pakistan's pesticide-free crops**, grown on smaller land holdings, are **more attractive to U.S. importers**, who face stricter residue regulations. This shift in demand could significantly impact India's market share, as Pakistan offers a cheaper and more compliant alternative, positioning itself favorably in the global rice market. - As part of the new tariffs announced by the **U.S.**, **Pakistan will face a 29% tariff on its rice exports, effective April 9**. This adds to the growing challenges for **Pakistani exporters**, who are already dealing with the impact of similar tariffs on other major rice-exporting countries like **Thailand and Vietnam**. **The U.S. is a key market for aromatic rice, including basmati**, and with the tariff increases, Pakistani rice may become less competitive, further affecting market share. The uncertainty created by these new tariffs is expected to disrupt trade and could potentially lead to higher rice prices in the U.S. while impacting Pakistan's export volumes. # WEATHER CONDITIONS IN PAKISTAN:

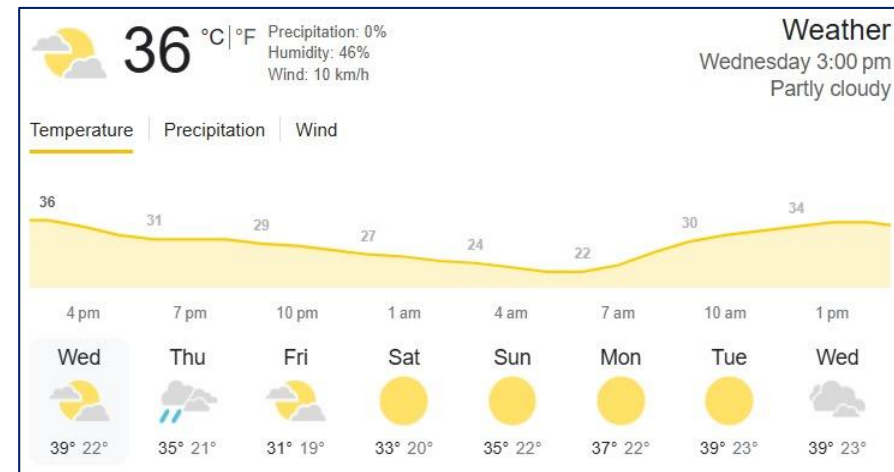
## Punjab PDMA Issues Alert on Potential Drought and Impact on Rabi Crops:

- Pakistan is facing a severe drought, with the **Provincial Disaster Management Authority (PDMA) Punjab reporting a 38% decrease in winter rainfall**. Areas like Bahawalpur, **Bahawalnagar**, and **Rahim Yar Khan** are especially vulnerable. This shortage is impacting Rabi season crops, particularly rice, leading to potential economic losses for farmers. The **PDMA** is preparing for water shortages in regions like Thal and Cholistan and is collaborating with the School Education **Department to raise awareness about the impact of water scarcity**. - The **entire country is experiencing a significant reduction in rainfall**, with a **70% drop in winter precipitation**. **Sindh and Balochistan**, reliant on **rain-fed agriculture**, are facing **severe drought conditions**. Additionally, diminishing water levels in rivers and reservoirs are affecting hydropower generation and water supplies. **Climate change, deforestation, and urbanization** are key factors driving these erratic weather patterns, which **disrupt traditional farming cycles** and increase the frequency of dry spells. - The drought is severely affecting crops, with **wheat yields expected to decrease by 30-35%**, while **sugarcane production has dropped by 50%**. In addition, urbanization is contributing to the crisis, as agricultural lands in Punjab are being converted into residential and industrial zones. Experts are urging climate action, policy reforms, and investments in sustainable farming practices, water conservation, and drought-resistant crops to prevent a worsening food crisis.

- This week super basmati prices **increased by 40\$** across **conventional, organic, and SRP grades**, **1121 basmati Parboiled and Steam** export prices increased by **\$25**.
- Non-Basmati varieties increased, with **386 Milled rice** rose by **\$35**, **IRRI-9 milled rice** by **\$35**, while **IRRI-6 milled rice** decreased by **\$25**.

- The **Global rice export market remained sluggish** with minor fluctuations the global price were impacted due to US import tariff.
- We learn from news that, Indian rice prices fell to their lowest since **June 2023**, with the **5% broken parboiled variety priced at \$395-\$401 per tonne**, down from **\$403-\$410** last week. Thai rice remained steady at **\$405 per tonne**, while **Vietnam's 5% broken rice rose to \$400 per tonne**. **Bangladesh** is set to lift the ban on aromatic rice exports to boost trade.

# GLOBAL RICE TENDER & TRADE UPDATE:

## South Korea Seeks 80,000 Tons of Rice Through International Tenders.

- South Korea's Agro Fisheries & Food Trade Corporation has issued tenders for **80,000 tons of rice**, with **51,000 tons sourced from the US**. Bids are **due by April 15, 2019**, and deliveries are expected between August 2025 and February 2026.

## Recent Rice Procurement Efforts and Trade Initiatives in Bangladesh.

- A total of **5,447 tons of rice** were imported from **India** through Hili Land Port in Dinajpur on Sunday, with 126 trucks delivering the shipment. The rice import period has been extended until April 15 by the Ministry of Food, and import activities are expected to increase further. **(7-Apr)**
- A vessel carrying **12,700 tons** of Sunned (Atap) rice from **Vietnam** under the **G2G agreement** arrived at Chittagong Port. Bangladesh has already received **60,000 tons** of rice as part of the **100,000-ton agreement**, with sample testing completed and unloading set to begin shortly. **(7-Apr)**
- A consignment of **10,850 tons of Indian parboiled rice** arrived at Chittagong Port on Thursday. Bangladesh has so far received **306,769 tons of rice from India** as part of a **500,000-ton import agreement**, with quality testing completed for the new shipment to begin unloading. **(3-Apr)**
- A consignment of **11,500 tons of non-basmati parboiled rice** arrived at Chattogram Port from India under package-2 to meet domestic demand. This is part of a **450,000-ton deal**, with **285,769 tons** already delivered. The rice import is aimed at addressing national emergency needs for the **2024-25 financial year**. **(25-Mar)**

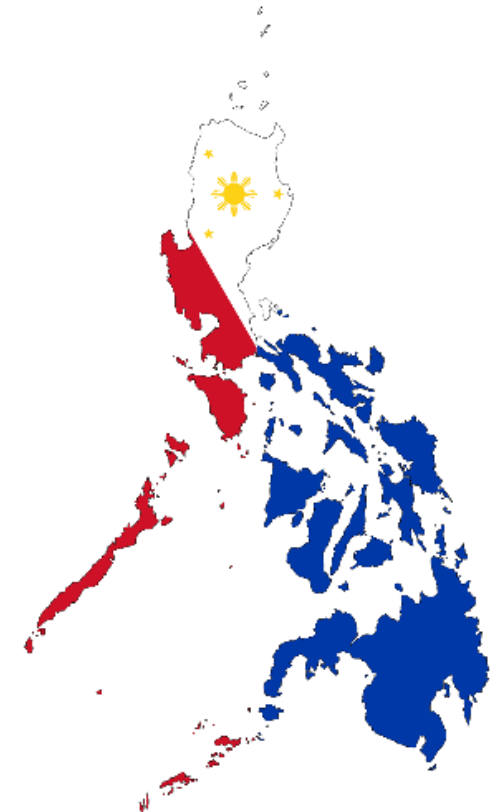

## Philippines Rice Imports to Decline in 2025 Amid Increased Domestic Production and Policy Changes

- Philippine **rice imports are expected to decline by 1.9% to 5.2 million metric tons (MMT) in 2025** due to increased domestic production and government interventions.
- Milled rice **production is forecast to rise by 2.1% to 12.25 MMT in 2025/26**, driven by favorable weather and the expanded Rice Competitiveness Enhancement Fund (RCEF). The Philippine government has increased the RCEF budget from P10 billion to P30 billion through the Rice Tariffication Law amendments.
- Vietnam and Thailand will remain the key suppliers of rice to the Philippines, although the supply of imported 5% broken rice is expected to decrease due to a **maximum retail price (MRSP)** on premium rice imports.
- The Philippines' rice **consumption is expected to grow by 0.6% to 17.30 MMT**, driven by population growth and improving economic conditions.
- Rice stocks in the **Philippines are projected to rise by 4.1% to 3.85 MMT**, largely due to increased government procurement and private sector imports.

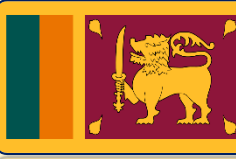

## US TARIFFS ON RICE: *“A blow to global exporters and market stability”*

- **INTRODUCTION TO THE TARIFFS:** On April 2, 2025, the United States imposed new tariffs on rice imports, as part of broader protectionist measures under President Donald Trump. These tariffs ranged from **26% for India**, **36% for Thailand**, and **46% for Vietnam**. The move primarily affects major rice-exporting countries, leading to significant market disruptions.
- **THAILAND’S STRUGGLES:** Thailand, the U.S.’s top rice supplier, faced a **36% tariff on its rice imports**. With Thailand’s **5% broken rice falling to its lowest price in over three years (\$395-400 per tonne)**, the country’s flagship rice, **Hommali**, could see prices rise to **\$1,400 per tonne**. This threatens to reduce U.S. demand for Thai rice, as consumers may turn to cheaper alternatives, notably from **Vietnam**. **Thailand shipped 850,000 tonnes of rice to the U.S. in 2024**, nearly **three times that of India**.
- **INDIA’S CHALLENGES:** India’s rice industry is also reeling under the **27% tariff**. The country exported **2.34 lakh tonnes of basmati rice to the U.S. in 2023-24**, but this could decline. India’s rice prices dropped to their **lowest levels in 22 months—\$392-400 per tonne** for **5% broken parboiled rice**. Exporters fear this will disrupt existing contracts, and **U.S. buyers may increasingly prefer cheaper alternatives from Pakistan or Vietnam**. This tariff could also force Indian exporters to lower procurement prices, directly affecting farmers, especially in Punjab.
- **VIETNAM’S SLIGHT RECOVERY:** Vietnam, despite a **46% tariff**, saw a slight price increase for its rice, with **5% broken rice priced at \$405-410 per tonne**. While tariffs do not directly affect its exports, the increased competition from other countries is hurting Vietnam’s market share. Vietnam’s rice exports to the U.S. **totaled nearly 250,000 tonnes in 2024**, but tariffs make this market less profitable.
- **GLOBAL MARKET SHIFTS:** Overall, the tariffs have led to a decline in global rice prices. **Thailand’s rice prices**, already at a three-year low, fell significantly. Indian rice prices also dropped as demand from African countries softened. **Vietnam’s rice exports**, while stable for now, face long-term pressure due to tariffs. These shifts are disrupting established trade patterns, with exporters now looking to redirect shipments to other markets.

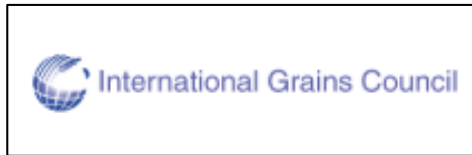

	<p>Vietnam's rice industry faces a dilemma between <b>expanding exports and managing domestic supply</b>, with export volume rising to over <b>9 million tons in 2024</b>. While markets like <b>the Philippines and Africa are growing</b>, the industry struggles with <b>production constraints</b> and rising prices. 	<p><b>Indonesia</b> plans to clear vast forest areas, including for rice production, as part of its food estate mega-project spanning <b>4.3 million hectares</b>. 	<p>Bangladesh's <b>milled rice production for the 2025-26 marketing year</b> is forecast to reach <b>37.55 million tonnes</b>, a <b>2.6% increase from the previous year</b>. Total rice consumption is projected at <b>38 million tonnes</b>, with imports expected to decline to <b>600,000 tonnes</b> due to improved production and a reduced <b>import tariff of 2%</b>. <a href="#">READ MORE</a> (04-Apr)</p>
	<p><b>Sri Lanka's Food Policy and Security Committee</b> has recommended <b>importing rice</b> to address an impending <b>shortage caused by adverse weather conditions and crop damage</b>, which has led to rising prices and consumer dissatisfaction. The government is also considering <b>importing broken rice</b> for animal feed and enhancing storage facilities to prevent future shortages. <a href="#">READ MORE</a> (03-Apr)</p>
	<p>Japan, highly reliant on rice, is <b>facing a rice shortage due to adverse weather</b>, causing prices to surge by <b>55% in two years</b>.
