# EMERGING BASMATI VARIETIES FOR NEW SEASON CROP: 2025–26



With the onset of the 2025–26 kharif season, discussions have intensified around the adoption of new and emerging basmati rice varieties. A notable trend this season is the increasing interest in variety 1718, which is reportedly being considered as a potential replacement for the widely cultivated 1121 basmati.

- ☐ These varieties are gaining attraction among growers due to certain agronomic benefits such as Improved yield potential & Better grain quality for export markets.
- As sowing continues and harvesting begins by the end of this month, clearer insights will emerge regarding the scale of cultivation and performance of these varieties across key basmati-growing zones.

Using certified varieties not only ensures better productivity but also strengthens Pakistan's position in the global basmati rice market by maintaining consistency, quality, and authenticity.

## PAKISTAN NEWS HIGHLIGHTS:

- Despite India's re-entry into the global rice market with heavy subsidies, Pakistan's rice exports remained stable due to a quality-focused, agile strategy. From July to September 2024, Pakistan averaged 550,000 tonnes in monthly exports, and overall FY25 exports stood at 5.544 million tonnes only a 0.87% drop from the previous year. However, a 3.7% fall in Kharif 2024 production is expected to cause a 15% export decline in April–June 2025. India's aggressive pricing \$349/tonne for 25% broken rice has sparked WTO complaints over subsidy violations, as their real FOB cost is closer to \$385/tonne. Read More (24th June).
- Pakistan's rice exports to **China** surged by **121%** in the first five months of **2025**, reaching \$32.076 million compared to \$14.53 million during the same period in **2024**. The bulk of this growth came from semi- or wholly-milled rice, which accounted for \$26.68 million and **60,769 metric tons**. Pakistani varieties like **Super Basmati** and **IRRI-6** are favored for their aroma, elongation, and cost-efficiency, offering a higher milling yield (**68–70%**) than Chinese rice (**66–68%**). Around **30–35% of these exports** are used in China's food processing sector, while the rest cater to the premium retail market. Read More (23<sup>rd</sup> June).
- In Rawalpindi, wholesale rice prices have surged by Rs400 per bag ahead of the new fiscal budget, with traders reducing rice supply by 30–40%. Shortages are being reported in markets, and further price hikes are expected due to newly imposed taxes and rising transport costs. Read More (23<sup>rd</sup> June).



## PAKISTAN is the 4<sup>th</sup> largest rice exporting country in the world.

- Pakistan's rice exports (FY 25) stood at 5.544 million tonnes
- Non-basmati rice exports between July and March reached 663,000 tonnes, up by 118,577 tonnes Y-O-Y.
- Pakistan controls **67%** of the **basmati brown rice market** in the **European Union** and the **UK.**


## RICE FARMING IN PAKISTAN:

#### Relief on the Horizon: Monsoon Rains Offer Hope Amid Water Shortages for Pakistan's Farmers

- ➤ The Pakistan Meteorological Department has forecast widespread monsoon rains across the country from June 25 to early July, vital for agriculture but also posing flood and landslide risks. Punjab, Sindh, KP, Balochistan, AJK, and Gilgit-Baltistan are expected to receive moderate to heavy rainfall, with urban flooding likely in low-lying areas of major cities like Lahore, Karachi, and Peshawar. Flash floods and landslides may occur in hilly areas, and farmers have been advised to plan activities accordingly. Pre-monsoon showers have already hit parts of Punjab, with Lahore recording up to 37 mm of rain.
- India suspended the **Indus Waters Treaty**, cutting water flow to Pakistan by nearly **17%**, with **Sindh receiving just 1.33 lakh cusecs** on June 16, down from **1.6 lakh cusecs** a year earlier. **Punjab** also saw a **2.25% drop**, threatening Kharif crops. India has also stopped sharing **hydrological data** and is advancing a canal project to divert western river waters to **Punjab**, **Haryana**, **and Rajasthan**. The 113-km canal and 12 tunnels could be completed in three years, signaling a major policy shift with long-term implications for **Pakistan's agriculture**.

### "Basmati Trade with Iran Faces Turbulence Amid Conflict — Shipments Stuck, Payments Delayed, Outlook Cautiously Stable"


- > Shipments Stuck Amid Conflict: Around 1 lakh metric tonnes of Basmati rice contracted for Iran are stranded at Kandla and Mundra ports due to the escalating Iran-Israel conflict, halting vessel movement and risking delivery.
- > <u>Payment Delays Mount:</u> Payments worth ₹1,500–₹2,000 crore for nearly 2 lakh MT of Basmati exports to Iran are currently delayed; exporters also face challenges securing war-risk insurance for shipments.
- Exports Near Last Year's Level: Despite disruptions, India's total Basmati rice exports to Iran in FY 2024-25 may still reach near last year's 0.86 million tonnes, as most shipments are contracted before July and new permits resume in October.
- ➤ <u>Price & Realization Gap:</u> Indian exporters received \$881/tonne on average from Iran in FY25, lower than the overall \$980/tonne export average. In April 2025, Iran's unit value was \$746/tonne versus \$852/tonne from other markets.
- ➤ <u>Iran's Market Shift & Uncertainty:</u> Iran's domestic **rice production** has increased by **0.7 million tonnes** over 7 years, but it still depends on **Basmati imports**. With the ongoing geopolitical tension, experts call for re-evaluation of trade risks and strategy in West Asia.





All Prices were updated on 23rd June 2025.

• This week, rice prices remained largely stable across both basmati and non-basmati varieties, with only minor fluctuations of \$5–\$10 per ton. Super Basmati, 1121 Basmati—Conventional, Organic and SRP also varieties like 386, IRRI-9, and IRRI-6 prices held steady showing limited movement.








> As per the news, Global rice prices showed mixed trends this week, with India's 5% broken parboiled rice edging up to \$378-\$386 per ton amid improving demand and a weak rupee. Vietnam's 5% broken rice dipped slightly to \$390, while Thailand's fell to \$415 due to weak demand and a stronger baht. Bangladesh continues to face high domestic rice prices, with government efforts failing to ease the burden on consumers.

## GLOBAL NEWS HIGHLIGHTS OF THIS WEEK:



India sees a growing opportunity to expand rice exports to Japan, where a recent surge in prices—doubling to ¥5,000 per 5 kg—has triggered a supply crisis. With Japan planning to increase imports and possibly lower tariffs, India can promote its sticky rice varieties like Joha from the Northeast, moving beyond Basmati and tapping into both Japanese and rising domestic demand, while also helping reduce the trade deficit. Vietnam exported 4.5 million tonnes of rice in the first five months of 2025, up 12.2% year-on-year, but export value dropped 8.9% to USD 2.34 billion due to a sharp 18.7% fall in average export price to 0.516 USD/kg. Despite strong demand from the Philippines (41.4% of total exports), domestic prices remained stable, and exports to Bangladesh surged 515.6-fold while those to Indonesia fell 97.9%. In **2024**, **Cambodia's rice sector** generated nearly **USD 2 billion** in revenue by exporting over **651,000 tons** of **rice** and **5.1 million tons** of **paddy**. The number of modern rice milling facilities surged from under 10 to over 80, while agriculture contributed **16.7%** to the GDP, with projected sector value reaching **USD 7.82 billion**. <u>READ MORE (19-Jun)</u>



The Philippines is pushing for rice self-sufficiency by 2027 through initiatives like the Davao de Oro Rice Technology Forum, showcasing hybrid seeds, drone farming, and modern methods to boost yields and cut costs. National programs like RCEF and Masagana 200 aim to raise productivity, though rising imports and low farmgate prices threaten farmer incomes, prompting calls for stronger government support. The Myanmar Rice Federation (MRF) targets 3 million tonnes of rice exports in FY2025–26, after exporting 402,000 tonnes (April—May 2025), including 217,070 tonnes of rice and 185,213 tonnes of broken rice. In FY2024–25, Myanmar earned over USD 1.129 billion from 2.48 million tonnes of rice and broken rice exports. READ MORE (17-Jun)
