In September 2025, non-Basmati rice exports plunged 66% year-on-year and 33% month-on-month, reflecting weak global demand and market pressures. The arrival of IRRI-9 in the markets is expected to begin from mid-October. Updated production figures and price trends will be shared in the upcoming issues.

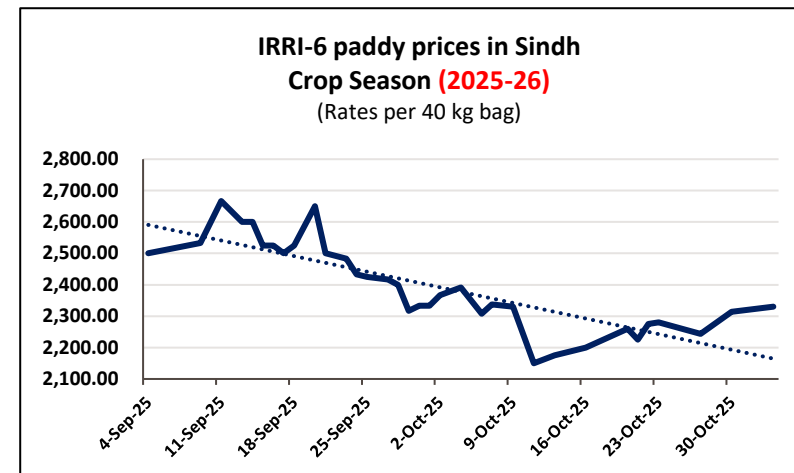


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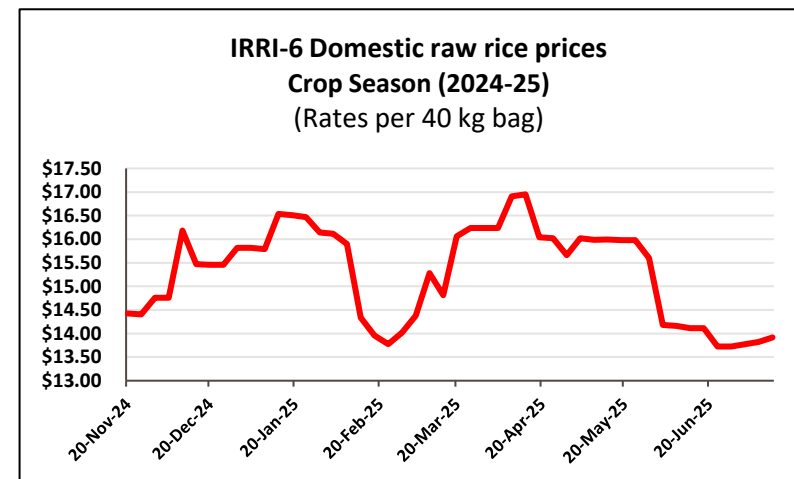

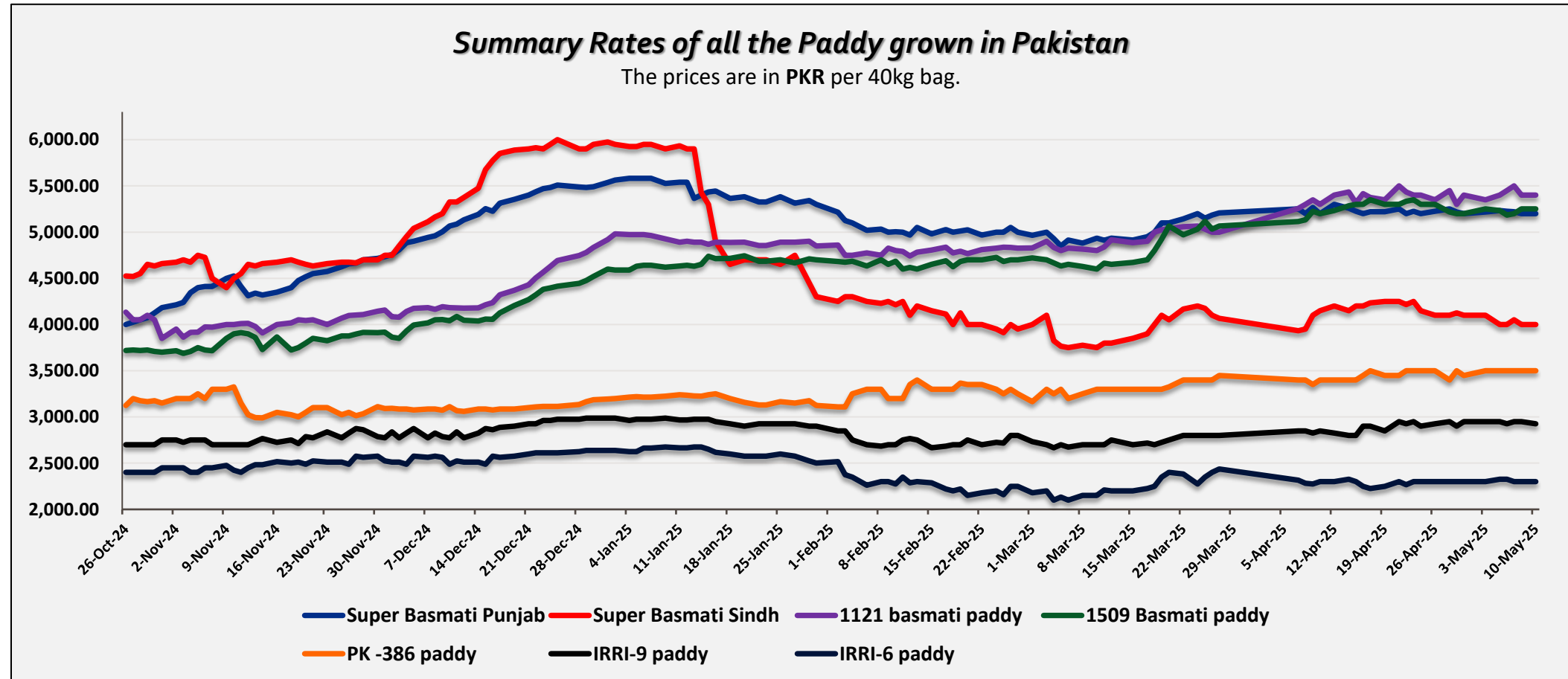

Pakistan Basmati Market Update – Early Crop Arrivals and Price Dynamics



- We have learned from the market that, The major crop of **Pakistan's Super Basmati and 1121 Basmati** has begun arriving in local markets. Initial arrivals were priced around **PKR 4,300–4,500 per 40 kg**, but current rates have risen to **PKR 4,800–5,000** and continue to trend upward. This upward movement is discouraging buyers, particularly as India is offering both Basmati and long-grain varieties at significantly lower prices.
- It is important to note that the current paddy is **primarily hand-cut**, a practice typical of early arrivals, which naturally commands higher prices. In the coming days, **thresher (mechanized) harvesting** is expected to start, coinciding with forecasts of a bumper Basmati crop this year. Already, **1509 Basmati** is present in bulk alongside **other non-Basmati varieties**, with reports of around **150,000 bags** being sold daily in several markets (mandis)—a record pace that underscores the scale of this year's harvest in Punjab and Sindh.
- Market observers indicate that **non-trade active participants (Stockiest)** may be contributing to **inflated prices**, as wealthier investors traditionally allocate capital to rice during the early harvest season, especially given the current slump in the land market. Such price dynamics could affect international trade sentiment and potentially discourage foreign buyers.
- Adding to the uncertainty, the **Afghanistan trade route remains closed** due to ongoing regional conflicts, further dampening export activity. Despite these temporary challenges, **RNT continues to monitor the market closely**, and we anticipate stabilization in the coming days. Previous reports have also detailed the impact of recent **floods on Pakistan's rice crops**, which remain a factor in market expectations.
- In summary, while early crop arrivals and speculative activity have pushed prices upward, the market fundamentals suggest a strong and abundant Basmati crop, and further clarity is expected as mechanized harvesting expands.

EMERGING BASMATI VARIETIES FOR NEW SEASON

With the onset of the **2025–26 kharif season**, discussions have intensified around the adoption of new and emerging basmati rice varieties. A notable trend this season is the increasing interest in **variety 1718**, which is reportedly being considered as a potential replacement for the widely cultivated **1121 basmati**.

- ❑ As sowing continues and harvesting begins by the end of this month, clearer insights will emerge regarding the scale of cultivation and performance of these varieties across key basmati-growing zones.

PAKISTAN NEWS HIGHLIGHTS:

- Mauritius is looking to revive **long-term rice import** deals with **India for around 33,000 tonnes** to support its subsidized food programme and reduce reliance on **Pakistan**, which became a major supplier after India banned **non-basmati rice exports in 2023**. Before the ban, India was the primary supplier through government deals. Mauritius requires about **1,000 tonnes of basmati** and **32,000 tonnes of non-basmati rice** annually, sold at highly subsidized rates to its 1.3 million population. The move comes after India lifted the export ban and follows strengthened bilateral ties between the two countries. [Read More](#) (2nd Nov).
- The **Agricultural Research Institute (ARI)** Dera Ismail Khan successfully tested a Chinese-imported crawler-type rice combine harvester, marking a step toward modernizing local agriculture. The machine efficiently performed cutting, threshing, and cleaning in a single cycle, showing strong adaptability to soft and waterlogged fields, reducing labour needs and **post-harvest losses**. Officials highlighted that such mechanization could boost productivity and farm efficiency, with further evaluations planned before large-scale adoption. [Read More](#) (03rd Nov).
- Pakistan's **rice exports fell 28% in Q1 FY26**, with **basmati down 45.5%** and **non-basmati 22.1%**, highlighting deep regulatory and institutional weaknesses. The introduction of the **NAFSA Ordinance** in 2025 disrupted the Department of Plant Protection's technical authority, while politically driven interventions, including **FIA involvement**, led to the removal of experienced phytosanitary officers. These changes created bureaucratic confusion, inconsistent inspections, and rising export rejections, damaging Pakistan's credibility in global markets. Experts call for restoring science-based regulation, upgrading laboratories, and professionalizing inspectors to revive export competitiveness. [Read More](#) (03rd Nov).
- China's Honglian hybrid rice has shown impressive yields in Pakistan, with varieties **H13, H14, and H15** producing **11.3, 12.3, and 10.8 tons/ha**, respectively, with **H14 outperforming local varieties by over 12%**. The China-Pakistan Joint Research Center for Honglian Hybrid Rice has promoted these varieties through demonstration bases, technical training, and seminars across Punjab and Sindh. Honglian rice, a scientific achievement of Wuhan University, has been introduced in Pakistan for over **20 years**, with the HP4 variety recently registered by the Pakistan Agricultural Research Council. The initiative has involved **over 200 stakeholders**, including farmers, distributors, and agricultural experts. [Read More](#) (04th Nov).



PAKISTAN is the 4th largest rice exporting country in the world.

- Basmati rice exports fell to **101,934 MT (\$107.29m)** from **186,673 MT (\$192.61m)** last year, marking a **sharp decline of –45%** in volume and **–44% in value**. (2024-25)
- **Non-basmati exports** stood at **443,469 MT (\$207.09m)** versus **430,071 MT (\$272.06m)** last year, with **volume up +3%** but value down **–24%**. (2024-25)
- Pakistan controls **67%** of the **basmati brown rice market** in the **European Union** and the **UK**.

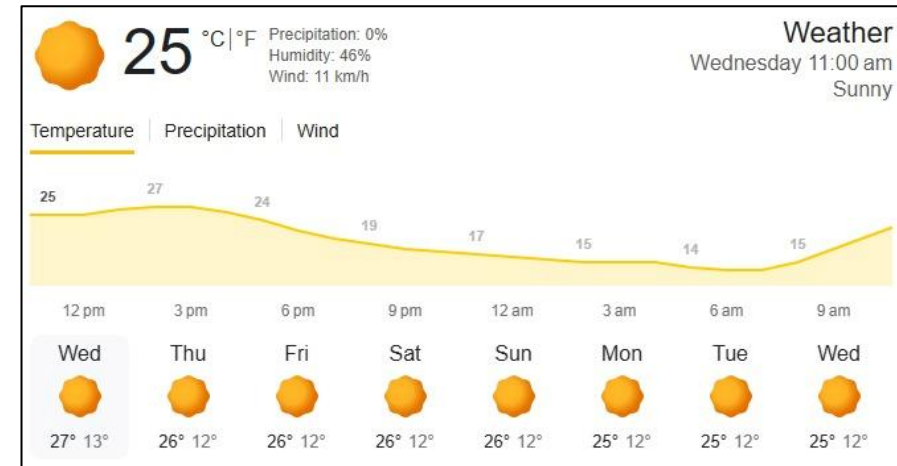
The Paddy Price Trap: Why Sindh's Farmers Lose In A Market Without Rules:

- As the **paddy harvest** begins across lower **Sindh**, what should be a season of prosperity has instead become a cycle of frustration and protest. Farmers from districts like **Badin**, **Sujawal**, and **Thatta** accuse rice millers of unjustified deductions on the pretext of high moisture content and rigged weighing scales often recording **32–35 kilograms** as one maund instead of 40. These deductions, coupled with falling **market prices** that have plunged from **Rs 3,600** to as low as **Rs 2,000–2,200 per maund**, have left smallholders struggling to recover even their **production costs**. Despite record cultivation over **2.1 million acres in 2025**, growers say they remain trapped in a market that rewards middlemen and millers rather than those who till the land.
- Behind the crisis lies a deeper governance void. **Sindh's agriculture department**, meant to regulate **moisture testing, pricing**, and scale verification, has largely withdrawn from its oversight role allowing private millers and traders to dominate procurement. With no standardized testing or certified weighing system, farmers are left vulnerable to arbitrary deductions and collusive pricing. Even as **Pakistan's rice exports** touch **US \$3.2 billion**, the farmers who produce it continue to lose ground. Experts and grower associations now urge the government to establish district-level **Rice Price & Quality Committees** and standardize inspection systems to restore fairness and rebuild trust between farmers, millers, and the state..
- ✓ The current weather is ideal for the new crop, especially **basmati rice**, sunny days and cool evenings mark the onset of winter in Pakistan, supporting healthy crop growth and timely harvesting.

- As per the news, Global rice prices showed mixed trends this week: Vietnam's 5% broken white rice fell to (\$370–\$375/ton) due to weak demand, while Indian prices held steady (\$344–\$360/ton) amid concerns over cyclone-related crop damage. Thailand's 5% broken rice rebounded slightly to \$350 to \$360/ton after a six-week decline, facing competition from cheaper suppliers. Bangladesh extended the aromatic rice export deadline to November 30 to manage shipments amid logistical delays.

GLOBAL NEWS HIGHLIGHTS OF THIS WEEK:

	<p>India's rice procurement jumped 46% in late October, with FCI buying over 70 lakh tonnes, bringing total October purchases to 119 lakh tonnes. Early harvesting in Punjab, Haryana, and Tamil Nadu drove the rise, exceeding last year's levels. The 2025–26 procurement target is 463.49 lakh tonnes, with purchases ongoing in other key states. 	<p>Vietnam's rice exports fell 6.5% in volume to 7.2 million tonnes and 23.8% in value to 3.7 billion USD in the first 10 months of 2025, with average export prices dropping 18.5% to 511 USD/tonne due to weak global demand. READ MORE (05-Nov)</p>
	<p>Cambodia's Ministry of Agriculture (MAFF) has ordered an investigation into provincial middlemen allegedly manipulating paddy trade, causing prices to fall from 1,200 to 600 riels/kg. Officials are tasked with identifying monopolists, coordinating with traders offering higher prices, and ensuring farmers can sell directly to improve transparency and stabilize the market. 	<p>The Philippines has extended its rice import ban until the end of 2025 to stabilise farm-gate prices of palay, which had fallen as low as P8/kg. Prices briefly rose to P13–P14/kg during the initial suspension but remained below the government's target floor of P17/kg. 	<p>Indonesia's boosted rice production in 2025, reaching 34.77 million tons, created a surplus of 3.8–4.15 million tons and helped lower global rice prices from around US\$650/ton to US\$371/ton. 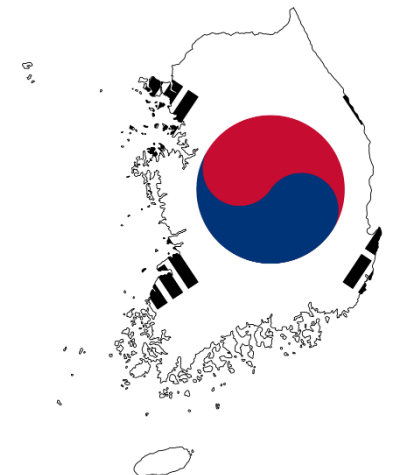
Bangladesh Issues New Tenders to Import 100,000 Tons of Rice

- Bangladesh's state grains buyer has issued a new international tender to purchase **50,000 tons of rice**, with price offers due by **November 13**.
- A separate tender for another **50,000 tons** was also issued, with offers submitted by November 3.
- The tenders aim to improve domestic rice supplies amid a **15% price rise over** the past year despite a good harvest.
- The rice sought is non-basmati parboiled, CIF liner out terms, from global origins except Israel, for shipment to Chittagong and Mongla ports **40 days after contract award**.



South Korea Issues Tender to Purchase 78,744 Tonnes of Rice from Multiple Origins

- South Korea's state-run Argo-Fisheries and Food Trade Corporation has announced international tenders to buy **78,744 tonnes of rice** from **China, Thailand**, and other countries, with bids due by **November 5, 2025**.
- The tender includes **56,944 tonnes of non-glutinous short-grain brown rice** from China, **1,800 tonnes of long-grain milled rice from Thailand**, and **20,000 tonnes of milled brewers rice** open to any source.
- Shipments are required to arrive between **December 15, 2025**, and **June 30, 2026**, as part of Korea's long-term procurement plan. The corporation previously purchased **157,717 tonnes of U.S. and Chinese rice** in a tender that closed on **September 30**, with awards issued on **October 20**. [Read More](#)
