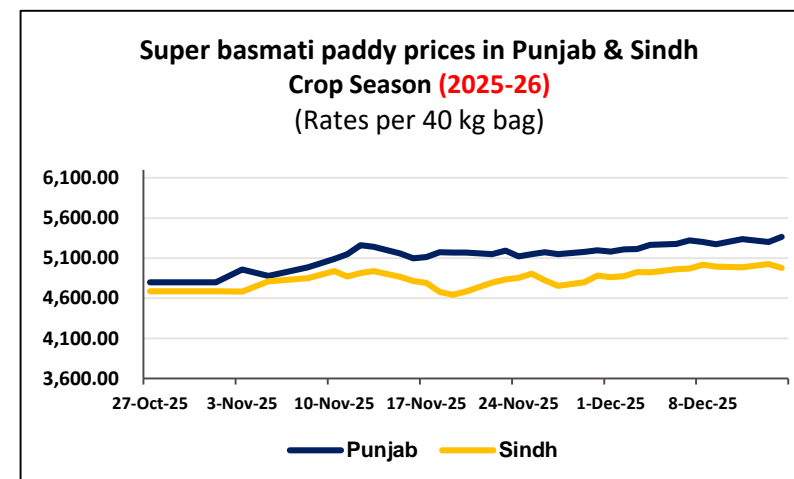

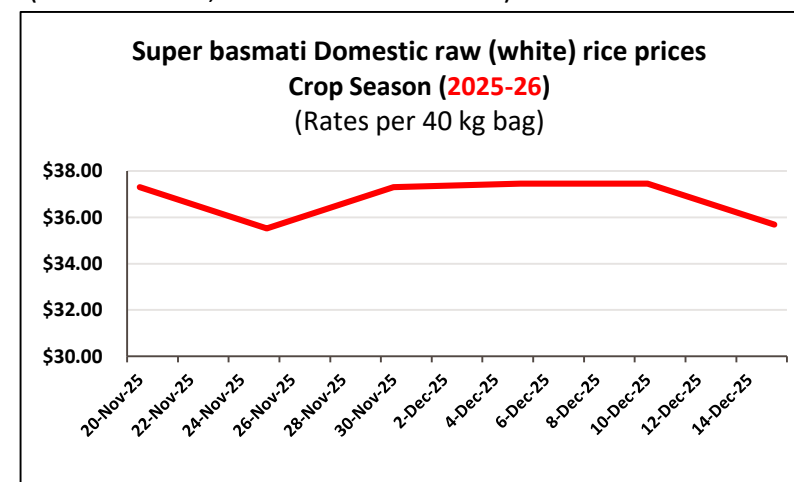

In Punjab and Sindh, paddy prices rose PKR 50-100 per 40 kg amid abundant stocks, but overall market activity is slow. The EU market remains subdued due to the holiday season, with Super Basmati brown rice offered around USD 860/ton. Export sentiment is expected to improve with Gulfood 2026 in January. Current super basmati paddy rates in Sindh are around PKR 4,950–5,050 per 40 kg, slightly increased with the last week level of paddy prices.

Bangladesh's multiple tenders and Pakistan's TCP tender for 100,000 tonnes of IRRI-6 may provide temporary demand support. The long-grain (LG) rice market is also under pressure globally, and there are rumors that India may reconsider exports of non-basmati rice due to domestic food security concerns. The IRRI-6 variety current paddy prices ranging between PKR 2,500–2,550 per 40 kg, showing an upward trend.

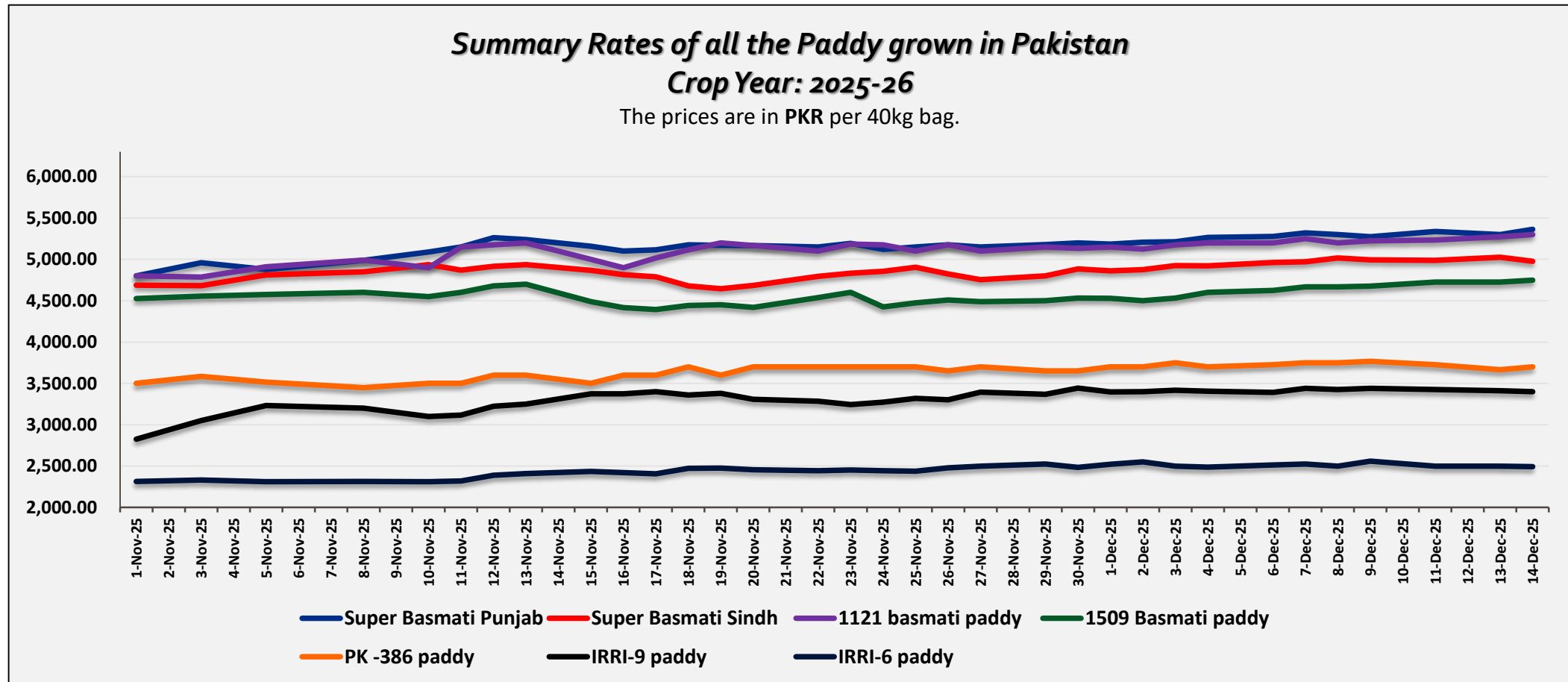

- ❑ Exporters of Pakistan may club these new varieties with traditional Super, 1121, and 1509 Basmati. Although it is still unclear whether these varieties will form an individual export category, yet they are now arriving in the market in good quantities.
- ❑ These varieties are gaining attraction among growers due to certain agronomic benefits such as Improved yield potential & Better grain quality for export markets.

Using certified varieties not only ensures better productivity but also strengthens Pakistan's position in the global basmati rice market by maintaining consistency, quality, and authenticity.

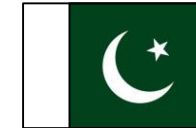

PAKISTAN NEWS HIGHLIGHTS:

- Iranian firm Jahad Sabz Company has issued a tender to buy **10,000 metric tons** of **1121 white basmati rice from Pakistan**. Traders have been informed that the deadline for price submissions is **December 30**. [Read More](#) (18th Dec).
- **Pakistan is one of the world's leading rice exporters**, yet domestic consumption of value-added rice products remains underdeveloped. Most innovation in rice such as parboiled, packaged, and ready-to-cook formats is directed toward export markets rather than local consumers, representing untapped potential. Expanding rice-based products for urban households seeking convenience could strengthen domestic **agro-processing**, broaden consumer choice, and deepen value chains without threatening wheat security. Encouraging such diversification aligns with market incentives, consumer demand, and entrepreneurial opportunities in the **food sector**. [Read More](#) (15th Dec).
- The **Rice Exporters Association of Pakistan (REAP)** has warned of significant export losses due to the ongoing transporters' strike, which has disrupted cargo movement nationwide. REAP highlighted that delays in shipments are affecting buyer confidence and Pakistan's competitiveness in the **global rice market**. **Truck suspensions** and road blockages are causing prolonged port delays, rising costs for exporters, and risks of missed deadlines. The association cautioned that continued disruption could lead to order cancellations and long-term reputational damage. **REAP urged Commerce Minister Jam Kamal Khan** to take urgent action to restore normal transport operations and protect Pakistan's rice export earnings. PAKISTAN is the 4th largest rice exporting country in the world.

- Total rice exports fell to **712,797 tonnes** in **Q1 FY26** from **991,146 tonnes** in **Q1 FY25**, a **28% decline**.
- Basmati rice exports fell to **137,066 tonnes** in **Q1 FY26** from **248,500 tonnes** last year, a **45.5% decline**.
- Non-basmati rice exports dropped to **575,731 tonnes** from **764,700 tonnes**, down **22.1%**.
- Pakistan controls **67%** of the **basmati brown rice market** in the **European Union** and the **UK**.

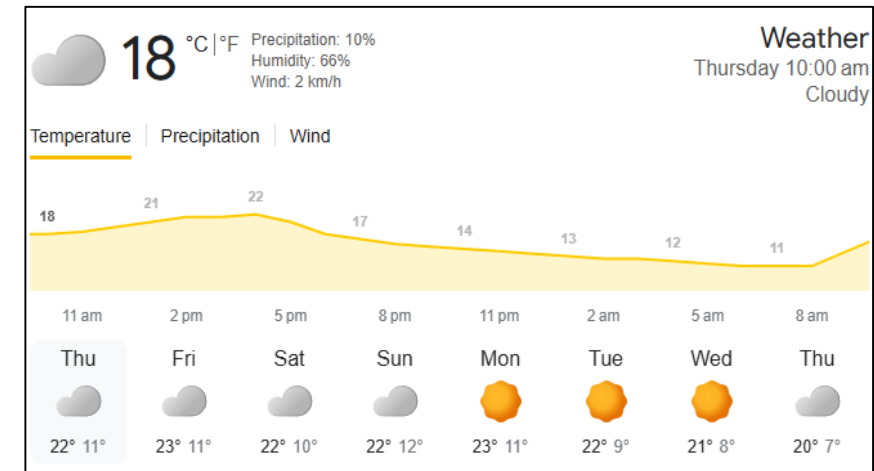
Guard Unveils High-Yield OP Basmati Varieties for 2026 Season

- Pakistan's rice sector is set to receive a significant boost with the introduction of two new **Open-Pollinated (OP) Basmati varieties** by **Guard Agricultural Research & Services Ltd.** Named **Guard-101** and **Guard-102**, these varieties are poised for commercial cultivation in the **2026 crop season**. The journey of these varieties began years ago with extensive research, rigorous field trials, and genetic verification. After being formally registered with the **Punjab Seed Council in 2023**, the varieties progressed through pre-basic and basic seed stages. This year, Guard completed large-scale seed multiplication, producing **27 tonnes of Guard-101** and **59 tonnes of Guard-102** across carefully selected areas in Narang, Sheikhupura, and Manga Mandi, laying the groundwork for widespread adoption by farmers next year.
- According to **Guard's Chief Executive, Shahzad Ali Malik**, **Guard-101** and **Guard-102** offer a yield potential of **50–55 maunds per acre**, with peak performance during trials reaching **60–65 maunds per acre**, putting them on par with renowned varieties like **Super Basmati 1121** and **1509**. Importantly, these varieties retain the traditional long grain, aromatic qualities, and cooking characteristics that define **Basmati rice**. **DNA verification conducted by Eurofins** confirmed their unique genetic identity, reinforcing Pakistan's commitment to varietal integrity in its **Basmati exports**. With their high yield potential, superior quality, and distinct genetic traits, **Guard-101** and **Guard-102** are expected to enhance the competitiveness of Pakistan's rice sector, offering farmers new avenues for higher productivity and quality production, while strengthening the country's reputation as a global leader in premium Basmati rice.

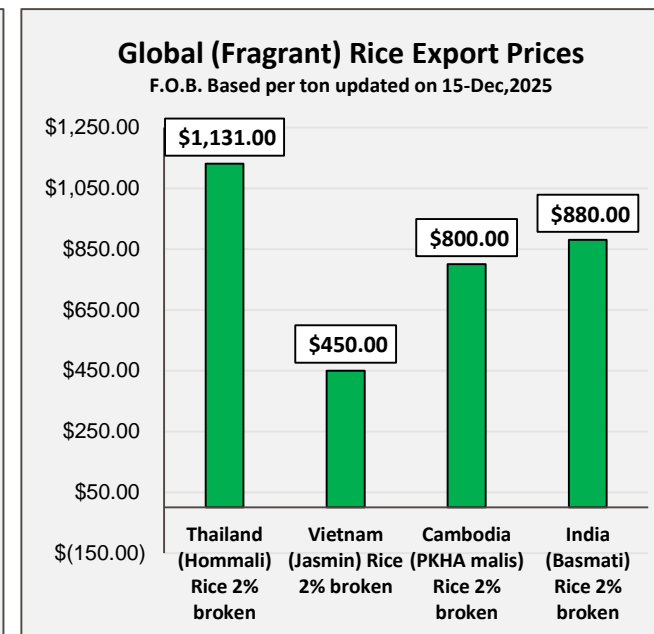
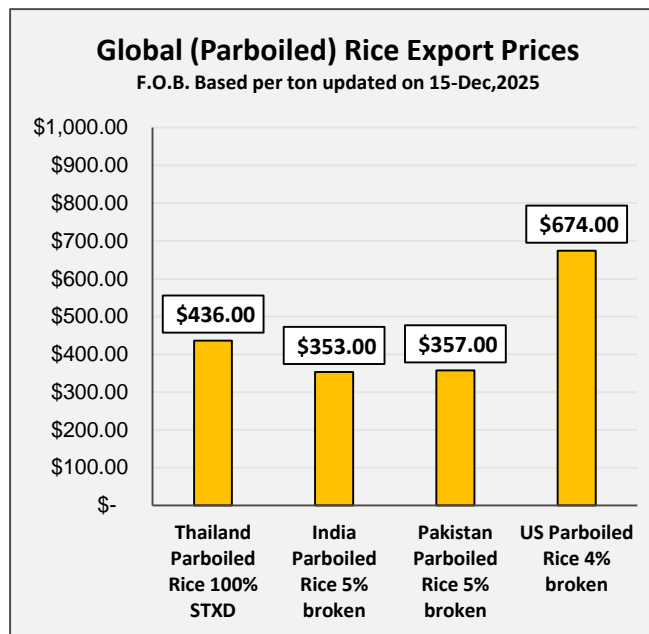
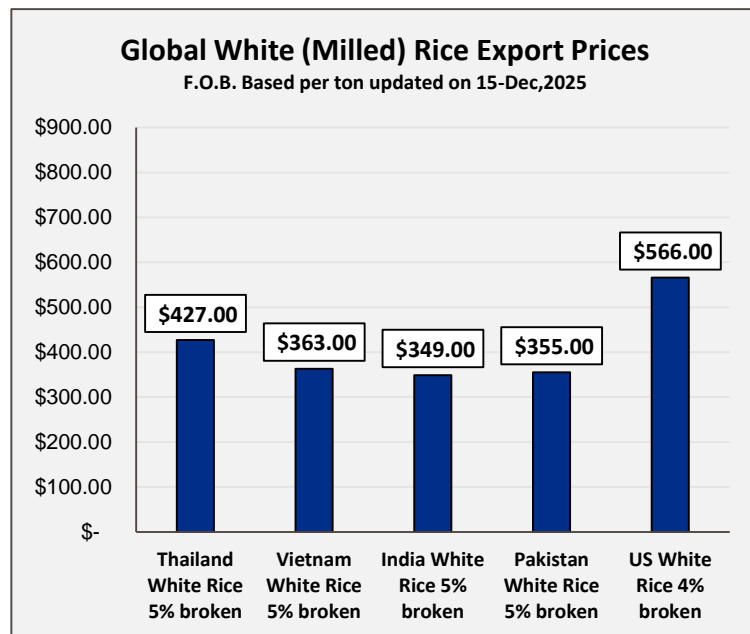
All Rice Prices were updated on 15th December 2025.

This week, prices for all major rice varieties remained largely stable, with minor fluctuations of \$5–10/ton. **Super Basmati**, **1121 Basmati** (parboiled and steam), **non-Basmati Long Grain - 386**, and **IRRI-6** white rice all saw only slight movements, reflecting a steady market.

GLOBAL RICE PRICES:

- As per the news, **Thailand's 5% broken rice** rose to **\$425/ton from \$400 last week**, hitting a six-month high due to floods and expected China purchases. **Indian 5% broken parboiled rice** held steady at **\$347–\$354/ton** and **5% broken white rice** at **\$340–\$349/ton**, supported by high paddy prices and rupee depreciation. **Vietnam's 5% broken rice** remained unchanged at **\$365–\$370/ton** amid weak demand.

MAJOR UPDATE THIS WEEK: (17 December 2025)

India says no dumping in premium basmati rice exports to US

- ❑ **Trump Threatens Tariffs on Indian Rice:** Last week, U.S. President Donald Trump again raised the prospect of additional tariffs on Indian rice, accusing India, Thailand, China, and Puerto Rico of “dumping” rice at below-market prices. The president linked these imports to rising costs for U.S. farmers and announced \$12 billion in aid to offset projected losses, partly funded by the tariffs.
- ❑ **India Rejects Dumping Allegations:** In response, India firmly denied U.S. claims of dumping, stressing that the majority of its shipments to the U.S. are premium-grade basmati rice. Commerce Secretary Rajesh Agrawal clarified that over 80% of Indian rice exports to the U.S. are basmati, which commands higher prices than non-basmati varieties, and noted that no U.S. anti-dumping investigation has been initiated.
- ❑ **Export Performance Remains Strong:** Despite the 50% tariff imposed in August, India’s exports surged 19.4% in November 2025 to \$38.1 billion, including \$7 billion in shipments to the U.S. Exports to China rose 90%, helping narrow the U.S.–India trade deficit from \$41.68 billion to \$24.6 billion.
- ❑ **Diplomatic Talks and Policy Support:** A high-level Indian delegation met U.S. Deputy Trade Representative Rick Switzer in Delhi to discuss the rice dispute and broader trade matters, including a potential bilateral trade agreement. Simultaneously, the Indian government is rolling out a Rs 25,060-crore export promotion mission to support exporters and maintain trade momentum.
- ❑ **Outlook for the Rice Sector:** India’s rice exports remain resilient despite tariff pressures and trade tensions. The focus on premium basmati rice, market diversification, and government support is helping exporters sustain growth while protecting global competitiveness. Analysts expect Indian rice shipments to the U.S. and other key markets to remain steady in the near term.

	<p>Thailand's GI-certified rice generated over 8 billion baht in economic value during January–September 2025, driven by 24 registered varieties from 31 provinces and supporting 600,000+ farming households. Phayao Hom Mali Rice led the segment with over 6.15 billion baht, highlighting strong domestic and international demand for premium GI rice. READ MORE (18-Dec)</p>
	<p>Afghanistan's rice production increased by 2% to 447,000 metric tons in 1404, with cultivation expanding 4.6% to 135,000 hectares across 18 provinces. Kunduz led with 41,000 hectares and, along with Takhar, topped output at 116,000 tons each, while total national rice demand is estimated at 720,000 metric tons. READ MORE (18-Dec)</p>
	<p>Philippine rice imports in 2026 are projected to fall below 4 MMT, estimated at 3.6–3.8 MMT, backed by expected domestic palay production of 20.3 MMT. Imports will face a 20% tariff (up from 15%), a mid-February arrival deadline, and tighter controls, compared with record imports of 4.8 MMT in 2024. READ MORE (17-Dec)</p>
	<p>India's rice exports remained largely stagnant at \$7.3 billion during April–November FY25, pressured by higher global stocks, strong global harvests, US tariffs, and Iran's deepening economic crisis. Exports fell 30% year-on-year in November 2025 to \$0.79 billion, while payment risks and import delays from Iran one of the largest basmati markets further weighed on demand despite India's 35 to 40% share of global rice trade. 	<p>Vietnamese rice prices are falling as the Philippines, Vietnam's largest market (39.8% share), temporarily halted imports, despite exports of 7.53 million tons worth \$3.85 billion in the first 11 months of 2025. Export volumes dropped 10.9%, values 27.4%, and prices 18.3% to \$512/ton, with a 4 million-ton Winter–Spring crop adding further pressure. READ MORE (15-Dec)</p>

GLOBAL RICE TENDER & TRADE UPDATE:

Bangladesh Accelerates Rice Imports with Multiple Tenders to Stabilize Domestic Prices:

- The government approved the procurement of **50,000 MT of non-basmati parboiled rice** at a cost of **Tk 214.70 crore** and the import of **80,000 MT of fertiliser from Saudi Arabia** to ensure food security and stable farm supplies. It also cleared plans to build fertiliser buffer warehouses in Naogaon and Bogura, alongside major infrastructure and road development projects to boost logistics and economic growth. *(16, December 2025)*
- Bangladesh's state grains buyer received its lowest offer of USD **355.77/ton CIF for 50,000 tons** of Indian non-basmati parboiled rice, submitted by **Pattabhi Agro Foods**. The tender is part of Bangladesh's continued rice imports to stabilize rising domestic prices, with final purchase decisions expected after price validity ends on December 29. Other offers ranged from USD 357.77–366/ton. *(16, December 2025)*
